Bumpers and fenders surround the boat to protect it whilst you're mooring or going under bridges. Each boat also carries lifejackets, fire blankets and extinguishers. Ask the base team to show you what's on board.



■ Professional maintenance

When you step on to your cruiser it will be clean and tidy and will have been checked over by our maintenance team. Every base has mechanics responsible for making sure that every boat passes our rigorous quality tests before you head off.



At your service seven days a week

If you have any problems and you are unsure of what to do, our multilingual base teams are ready to help, seven days a week. If it's outside of office hours, our answering service will give you an emergency number to call.







Do I need experience?

No. Lots of our clients are first timers and find our boats very easy to manoeuvre. Once you have booked your holiday, you will receive your Captain's Manual, detailing some of what you can expect to experience on board. When you arrive at the base, our team gives you a tour of your boat and supervises as you cast off for the first time. They are happy to give you as much tuition as you need to feel comfortable and confident at the helm.

Frequently Asked Question

Do I need a special licence?

In France and Germany, once you have received your instruction from the base team, you are given a provisional licence that lasts the duration of your holiday. In Holland, Ireland, England, Scotland and Italy you can cruise permit free. In Germany, a permit is required if you wish to cruise on Berlin and Potsdam waterways.

How easy is it to navigate?

The waterways selected by Crown Blue Line are largely non-tidal, with only the gentlest of currents, making them extremely easy to navigate.

How easy is it to moor?

■ You can stop almost wherever you wish; along the banks of the waterways in the middle of the countryside or in a marina in the town centre. There are a large number of free mooring places throughout Crown Blue Line cruising regions. A few of the mooring spots in tourist areas do require a small fee to be paid.

Which region should I choose?

■ Take a look through your brochure and check our website for more information. Give us a call and speak to our sales team who will be able to recommend holiday routes and itineraries depending on your interests. Once you have booked you can purchase a detailed canal guide of your chosen region to enable you to start planning your itinerary.

How far can I go in a day?

Your normal cruising speed is around 7/8 km per hour and it takes about 20 minutes to go through a lock. If you plan to cruise for no more than 4 to 5 hours per day you'll cover between 25/40 km per day, depending on the number of locks in the region.

What time can I collect/return my boat?

You can pick up your cruiser up between 4pm and 6pm and should return it by 9am on your final day. For short breaks you pick your cruiser up at 2pm and return it by 10am on your final day.

What happens if we have a problem?

At every base, our multilingual team is ready to help, seven days a week. Simply call the base and they will be happy to assist you. If you own a mobile phone, it's a good idea to take it with you, just in case.

Do I need special insurance?

■ Your boat is fully insured and you are only liable for any damage up to the amount of your security deposit. Alternatively you can opt for the damage waiver scheme. See the booking form for further details

Where can I leave my car?

■ All of our bases have free open-air car parking as well as an enclosed parking area, which can be used for a small fee. At a few of our bases there is also undercover parking, which can be used for a small fee.

What if I need to cancel?

■ It's always disappointing to have to cancel your holiday plans, especially if you cannot be reimbursed for the cost of your cruise. Take a look at our cancellation plan, which is detailed on the back of the booking form.







Be seduced by the south

Europe's oldest waterway is unique due to its sheer size and the cleverness of its design. The canal stands as testament to French architect, Pierre Paul Riquet, and is a joy to navigate. Listed as a UNESCO world heritage site, the Canal du Midi transports you from the sun-drenched hillsides of Minervois to the vineyards of Aude and Cather and the pristine beaches of the Mediterranean. Pass through the peaceful Etang de Thau, a huge salt water lake lined with pretty fishing ports and inviting waterfront restaurants. Spot wild flamingos wading on the salt plains as you glide by!

Castelnaudary/ Port-Cassafières or vice-versa

Known as La Cite, Carcassonne is an extraordinary fortified town. Enjoy cycle trails at **Trèbes**. Stock up on local vintages at **Marseillette**'s co-operative. Lezignan-Corbières is the capital of the corbières wine region; visit the town's museum of Vine and Wine to learn more. Walk through the stunning public gardens at Béziers.

■ Castelnaudary/Toulouse

Canal du Midi

Stretch your legs at Mas-Saintes-Puelles and enjoy splendid views over the Lauragais region. Cruising past colourful fields, the towns of Port Lauragais, Naurouze and Villefranche are a short cycle away. Built in red brick, the beautiful city of Toulouse is home to the St. Sernin Basilica, the largest Romanesque church in the world.

Canal du Midi

Wander round Europe's largest and best preserved medieval fortress, the city of **Carcassonne**. **Homps** is home to several wine producers that are well worth a visit. Delight in the superb view from the 14th century castle that dominates the canal at Argens Minervois.

■ Port-Cassafières/Narbonne

Canal du Midi - Canal de la Robine

The **Fonserannes** Staircase lock system gives you stunning views over the Orb Valley. Enjoy wines at the 400-year-old vineyard next to the **Guery** aqueduct. Pick up a rare edition or bestseller from the second hand bookshop at Le Somail. Entering Narbonne is quite spectacular. The canal passes under the Merchant's Bridge, one of the few left in France lined with houses

■ Port-Cassafières / Aigues-Mortes

Canal du Midi - Canal du Rhône à Sète

Walk a short distance from Port Cassafieres to relax beside the Mediterranean Sea. Take a guided tour of the Noilly Prat vermouth cellars at **Marseillan**. Discover the comic strip museum at **Palavas-les-**Flots and the Henri Prades archaeological museum at Lattes. The striking Tower of Constance welcomes you as you moor at Aigues-Mortes.

■ Tempting seafood such as fresh oysters and sumptuous mussels can be found in abundance in the Camargue. Ripe tomatoes, olive oil and full flavoured garlic bulbs all combine to make tasty and aromatic sauces for meat or fish.





Camargue

A captivating wonderland

From St. Gilles, the gateway to the Camargue, you can discover one of France's most remarkable regions. Pink clouds of flamingos, herds of wild white horses and jet black bulls pepper the landscape as you cruise to the beautiful walled city of Aigues Mortes, which invites you to step back in time through its vibrant summer festivals. The immense expanse of the Etang de Thau salt water lake is lined with waterfront restaurants serving tasty seafood. A short bike ride away is the spectacular Languedoc countryside, home to almost three quarters of a million acres of vineyards. Pick up a few bottles of local vintage to enjoy on deck in the glorious Southern sunshine.





1 WEEK - ONE WAY TRIP

■ St-Gilles/ Port-Cassafières or vice-versa

Canal du Rhône à Sète

Enjoy a game of golf or tennis or lay a bet at the casino in La Grande Motte. Visit the Eco Site at Mèze or cycle to Mourre Blanc and learn about oyster and mussel breeding before sampling the real thing! Marseillan is home to Noilly Prat vermouth, take a trip round the famous cellars. Join a guided tour of Agde and learn more about one of France's oldest towns.

Relax on seven kilometres of golden beach at **Carnon** or discover the shady alleys and small squares of **Frontignan**, which provide lovely venues for an aperitif of Muscat. Indulge in fresh seafood at a waterfront restaurant on the **Etang de Thau**.





■ Le Mas d'Agenais/Condom

OR VICE-VERSA

Canal latéral à la Garonne - Baïse

Moncrabeau is home to the 'academy of liars' which was formed in the 17th century! On a good day you can look out over the straits of Gibraltar from the town. Take your sketchbook ashore at Valance sur Baise, a picturesque fortified town overlooking the Baise region or enjoy a measure of Armagnac in its home town of Condom.

■ Le Mas d'Agenais/ Moissac/Nérac

Canal latéral à la Garonne - Baïse

A remarkable Rembrandt hangs in **Le Mas- d'Agenais** in the Romanesque St. Vincent's church. Intrigue your palate with wine tastings at **Buzet-sur-Baise** and visit L'Espace Pruneau at **Agen** to learn more about succulent prunes. Cycle through **Valance d'Agen**, a stunning example of a bastide town. Take a picnic ashore at **Nèrac** and browse through the excellent art gallery.

■ Le Mas d'Agenais/Lustrac

Canal latéral à la Garonne - Baïse, Garonne, Lot

Explore the labyrinth of prune vines at **Granges sur Lot**. **Laparade** enjoys panoramic views across the Lot valley, great for sketching or painting. Plant lovers will be in their element at Latour Marliac water nurseries in **Le Temple sur Lot**. Join one of the guided walks at **Villeneuve sur Lot** that take place every morning.

Lot Magnificent gorges

Tucked behind tobacco fields and walnut copses of the Quercy region lie the wide valleys and dramatic gorges of the Lot river. Enjoy a swim in the clear waters and cool off on a hot summer's day. A bird watcher's delight, the Lot valley is renowned for the wild birds that can be seen including colourful kingfishers, majestic eagles and graceful herons.

1 WEEK - RETURN TRIP

■ Douelle/Luzech/Cregols

Towering over **Mercuès** is an imposing 7th century castle and famous restaurant. Cruising to **Cahors**, famous for its wine, you'll find the 14th century Valentré Bridge, a stunning structure with three towers. ■ It's important that you choose a large enough boat to comfortably accommodate your party. The capacity and dimensions of each boat can be found within each boat's description. When you see two figures (e.g. 6 + 2) the first shows the capacity not exceeding two people per cabin while the second shows the number of extra berths, usually in the saloon. The boat photograph will give you an overall impression of the model and the layout plan clearly shows how your party will be accommodated on board. Some layouts differ slightly – but the accommodation will generally be as shown.

Departure dates

■ Each boat has a specific departure day – usually Monday, Friday or Saturday. Once you've chosen your boat and region you should check the departure day when making your booking.

Short breaks

■ Don't forget that – subject to availability – many of our boats are available for short breaks at certain periods mid week and at weekends. Please ask for details and prices.

Ready to go!

Before departure, your boat will have been thoroughly cleaned and all mechanical equipment carefully checked. The full tank of diesel is sufficient for one or two weeks of cruising and the water supply should last about two days before you need to refill at one of the many water points shown in your canal guide.

Equipment on board

- Galley: Each galley has generous work surfaces, a sink, cooker with oven and grill, large cupboards and one or two refrigerators depending on the size of the boat. A full range of cooking utensils, cutlery, crockery and glassware is also provided.
- Bathrooms: Depending on the size of the boat, you'll find one, two or even three bathrooms with shower, toilet and in some cases even a bath! All boats have large water tanks with a generous supply of hot and cold water.
- Bed Linen: A complete set of bed linen is provided, including sheets, duvets or blankets. Towels are also provided.
- Storage Space: There is plenty of cupboard and wardrobe space on each boat for storing clothing and belongings and our latest boats have a safe for your valuables.
- Safety Equipment: You'll find all the required safety equipment on board your boat: first aid kit, fire blanket, fire extinguishers and life jackets. Children's life jackets are also available and should be requested at your base prior to departure.
